CALL TO ORDER: President Mandel called the meeting to order at 7:17 p.m. after the Board of Health meeting.

CEREMONIAL MATTERS AND/OR TOPICS FOR PRIORITY CONSIDERATION

Proclamation for Jewish American Heritage Month

President Mandel read the proclamation for Jewish American Heritage Month and the Council presented the proclamation to representatives from Beth Chaim and the Chabad of the Windsors.

Mr. Cutler thanked West Windsor Township for the proclamation. He stated he was one of the founding members of Congregation Beth Chaim and provided a history of the temple since 1976.

Revolution NJ and the 250th Anniversary of the Founding of the United States in 2026

Mr. Paul Legeti, President of the Historical Society of West Windsor Township provided a brief history of the Revolutionary

War and how West Windsor Township was involved. He reviewed Revolution West Windsor's purpose and goals and noted it will run until December 2026 or possibly beyond. Mr. Legeti provided examples of projects and ways the group plans to celebrate the founding of the Nation and encouraged residents to visit the Revolution West Windsor website as well as the Township website for more information.

Complete Streets Discussion

President Mandel stated this discussion includes complete and green streets and will be voted on at a future meeting. She noted the Environmental Commission will be having a discussion on this topic at their next meeting.

Mayor Marathe provided background on the complete and green streets resolution and policy. He stated Sustainable NJ recommends the adoption of an updated resolution with the complete and green streets policy to reinforce West Windsor's practice of providing safe, environmentally health, economically sound, equitable, accessible and convenient travel along and across streets for users of all ages and abilities whenever feasible to do so and for all modes of transportation including motorists, bicyclists, pedestrians, public transportation vehicles and their passengers and commercial vehicles. Mayor Marathe stated the Township will continue to work with the Bicycle and Pedestrian Alliance and based on input from the Council and the public he will work to have it on a future agenda.

Councilmember Geevers questioned in the Resolution whether the title of Director of Community Development and Township Engineer should be worded as the same person and supports consistent wording throughout the resolution and policy.

Mayor Marathe stated the titles of Director of Community Development and Township Engineer may not be held by the same person in the future but he will review the document for consistency.

President Mandel asked Mr. Herbert to confirm the person making a proposal and the person approving a proposal needs to be two

different people and she stated an alternate title should be noted in the Resolution and policy.

Mayor Marathe explained the Township based the resolution from the template provided by Sustainable New Jersey and modified it for West Windsor Township.

Discussion ensued on Section #4 of the policy regarding a conducting a 2-year audit.

President Mandel requested in Section #9 of the policy there be language included for the Township Engineer to provide a report on an annual basis.

Ms. Schmid suggested the report be provided in February to Council.

Discussion ensued on removing the word "however" from Section #2.

Discussion ensued on Section #2 regarding the Township Engineer, if this is the same person as the Director of Community Development, directing a designee.

President Mandel noted she supports adding green streets to the resolution and policy as well as the environmental component and passing this resolution will give the Township points from Sustainable New Jersey towards recertification.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Mark Pepper, 43 Providence Court, thanked the Council for the Proclamation for Jewish American Heritage Month and expressed his concerns for Israel and division among the Jewish community.

Mr. Mike Schuit, 234 Windsor Court, as Acting President of the Friends of West Windsor Open Space read a letter from the Commissioner of the NJDEP approving FOWWOS's application for a Green Acres matching grant for the Moses Tatonomy Trail.

Ms. Anne Pepper, 43 Providence Court, expressed her support for Representative Bonnie Watson Coleman and Senator Andy Kim and

asked Council to support these legislators as they work to pursue peace.

Ms. Ateka Gunja, 68 Berkshire Way, East Brunswick, expressed her support for an end to violence in Palestine and thanked Council for the Proclamation for Jewish American Heritage Month.

Mr. Yeou-Shiuh Hsu, 32 Horner Lane, Princeton, expressed his support for Representative Bonnie Watson Coleman and Senator Andy Kim on their position of an arms embargo on Israel.

Ms. Nawal Tuleil, 46 Tall Oaks Circle, East Brunswick, expressed her support for an arms embargo on Israel and an end to violence in Palestine.

Ms. Ann Clifton, 18 Galston Drive, on behalf of the West Windsor Bicycle and Pedestrian Alliance expressed support for the Complete and Green Streets Resolution and Policy and thanked Administration and Council Members for their support. She stated she will also be forwarding a survey to Council for their input that will be included with the recertification application to Sustainable New Jersey.

Mr. Dave Kimmel, 11 Scott Avenue, expressed his support for the changes made by Council to the Complete and Green Streets Resolution and Policy and suggested additional amendments.

ADMINISTRATION COMMENTS

Mayor Marathe noted the suggested amendments to the Complete and Green Streets Resolution and Policy and stated a modified copy would be forwarded to Council.

Ms. Schmid made the following announcements:

- DPW is currently collecting yard waste in Zone 1. Do not put out additional yard debris curbside once crews have collected.
- Residential Garbage Collection is once a week year-round including summertime. Garbage should be placed at the curb no later than 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled collection day. Information regarding acceptable and non-acceptable items

and requirements on how to ready them for collection can be found on the Township website

- Spring Clean Up Day is this Saturday at the Department of Public Works from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for residents only. The New Jersey Bike Exchange will be collecting unwanted bicycles and Goodwill donations will also be accepted.
- NJDEP is advising New Jersey is still in a water supply drought. Please consider conserving water.

Mayor Marathe reminded residents tax payments are due May 1st. He congratulated FOWWOS for the NJDEP grant approval for the Moses Tatamy Trail. Mayor Marathe wished his mother a Happy 92nd birthday and noted the Senior Center will begin bus service tomorrow. He also noted he completed his second New York City Saunter this Sunday.

COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Whitefield stated he had no comments at this time.

Councilmember Gawas wished a happy birthday to Mayor Marathe's mother and a happy Cinco De Mayo to everyone celebrating. She welcomed a boy scout in attendance for his merit badge and welcomed all to attend Council meetings. Councilmember Gawas noted she attended the verbal vortex competition as a judge and was impressed by the students.

Councilmember Weis thanked everyone who made comments and shared their opinions and encouraged everyone to use their voice for all levels of representatives. He noted Council has the responsibility to represent the residents and supports Council engagement with the community.

Councilmember Geevers thanked everyone for their comments and wished everyone a happy Cinco de Mayo. She welcomed the Boy Scouts to the meeting and encouraged everyone to stay involved. Councilmember Geevers stated she held office hours at the Municipal Building on April 22nd and a concern was noted regarding an Airbnb. She stated she attended the Arbor Day celebration on April 26th and she thanked the organizers of the celebration. Councilmember Geevers recognized a new little free library next to the school house on the Schenk Farmstead and she

thanked the Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution for funding the project and the Historical Society of West Windsor for approving the location and their participation.

CHAIR/CLERK COMMENTS

Council President Mandel reminded everyone of the Revolution West Windsor logo contest and to see their website for more information. She stated she held office hours at the Municipal Building on April 22nd so residents could meet Council leadership. President Mandel thanked everyone who came and reminded residents they are also available anytime outside of their office hours. She thanked everyone who participated in the Arbor Day celebration and noted this year Council participated in voting for the winners and the artwork was amazing. President Mandel stated the Moses Tatomny Trail matching grant has been approved by the NJDEP. She noted the following events she attended: Duck Pond Park litter cleanup on April 27th with residents, FOWWOS and the WaterShed Institute; Historical Society open house and little library dedication on May 4th and spring opening of the West Windsor Farmers Market.

Ms. Sheehan reminded residents the Memorial Day Parade will take place on May 26th and organizations who would like to participate need to contact the Clerk's Office by May 16th. She noted the following information: Primary Election is June 10th; Early Voting is June 3rd thru June 8th; last day to register to vote for the Primary Election is May 20th; Candidate forms for Mayor and two Council positions are available in the Clerk's Office and are due back to the Clerk's Office no later than 4:00 p.m. on August 21st; waiting to hear from the Board of Elections for an Early Voting Location in West Windsor for the General Election; see the Township website for election information.


